LAKE DESMET

Just 7 miles north of Buffalo, is a popular destination for anglers looking for trophy-sized trout, largemouth bass, and even walleye. One of the most used standing-water fisheries in Northeast Wyoming, the lake offers RV & tent camping complete with vault toilets, 2 well maintained boat docks, swimming areas & beautiful views. Stop at the Lake Stop Resort for gas, tackle, convenience store items, or get lunch at the full bar and restaurant. They also offer a motel and camp spaces complete with views of the Bighorns & a swimming pool.

FORT PHIL KEARNEY

Located some 12 miles north of Buffalo, on I-90 at exit 44. The Fort Kearny Historic Site offers guided tours around the fort, archaeological remains and other landmarks. Battlefield sites from the Fetterman Massacre and Wagon Box Fight are still preserved. Fort Phil Kearny Interpretive Center now offers guided tours & events, some even with dramatized accounts of historical events, throughout the year.

10 N. Main St. Buffalo - With its modest beginnings as a camp spot for a group of travelers along the Bozeman Trail in the summer of 1879, it soon became the foundation of our town. Now fully restored, be sure to attend the famous Thursday Night Jam each week in the Saloon, eat breakfast at the Busy Bee Cafe & enjoy fine dining at The Virginian, located in the building.
